


To find articles on Dietetics / Nutrition, use the links to PubMed, Ovid and other databases from the Library Home Page.

Signing on to authenticate at the key  when off campus, will enable linking out to **licensed** full text e-journals directly from the many diverse databases. **Please contact the library if you have any questions concerning searching or need advice on a topic.** Although dietetics and nutrition topics are covered in MEDLINE, a literature review using various databases and resources may be considered. Selected licensed resources for Dietetics / Nutrition

OID

- ✚ **MEDLINE** – Structured, guided searching. Suggests MeSH headings and limits with subheading topic categories.
- ✚ **Evidence Based Medicine** – All EBM Reviews Link out from Ovid, most EBM databases are full-text.
- ✚ **HealthStar** – Patient outcomes, effectiveness of programs, products and services.
- ✚ **Global Health** - International in scope, non-western journals.

PubMed – An additional recommended search interface for **MEDLINE**. Search the *Clinical Queries* to quickly find systematic reviews, etiology, diagnosis, therapy and prognosis. Icons link to Tulane subscriptions.

The Web of Science: Science Citation Index, Social Sciences Citation Index – 1996-present.

EBSCO Research Databases – *Over 45 specialty databases available, many with full text links. Examples:*

- ✚ **AGRICOLA** – USDA database on food, nutrition, agriculture, etc.
- ✚ **CINAHL** – Nursing and Allied Health.
- ✚ **Health Source** – Health, medicine and nursing, hard-to-find herbal and nutritional supplements.
- ✚ **SPORTDiscus** – Exercise and sports medicine.

Cambridge Scientific Abstracts (CSA Illuminata) – *Choose among the many available databases. Examples:*

- ✚ **ERIC** – Education topics.
- ✚ **Physical Education Index** – Health and physical fitness, sports medicine.
